List of Reference books has been provided to students. • To ensure effective curriculum delivery each faculty member submits a syllabus teaching plan, work plan to the principal at the beginning of the session. ? Guest Lectures by experts are also arranged regularly for quality studies. • Development and improvement of different methods of effective curriculum delivery: Along with the traditional chalk and talk method, teachers often use power - point projections during the lectures to demonstrate topics. Use of the scientific models and charts for effective lecture delivery and Group discussion amongst the students during the class were also followed. • Proposal for new courses M.Sc. Botany, Zoology, Physics, Information Technology, Computer Science has been sent to department of higher education for sanction. • Induction programme is organised every year for newly admitted students to make them aware of the mechanism for curriculum delivery and implementation and other information. • Proper and adequate instrumentation facilities are given to the students for their practical classes. • Need based survey programme, field works and educational excursions/tours are organized by the departments. Field visits are organised by department of Geography, Economics, Political science. Psychology, Home science and Zoology. • Students are encouraged to read the news papers like Business Standards, Economic times and other important news papers in the college library and some departments • Huge Notice boards are fixed at strategic point on the campus and the boundary walls of the college building also serve the purpose. • Helpdesk is available to guide the students and parents regarding various matters related to admission process, examination and other activities. • College prospectus is given to the applicants along with the application forms and the prospectus contains information about the institution and the programmes offered. The prospectus that highlights the details of various programmes of the college is prepared every year prior to the commencement of admissions. The prospectus also gives details of eligibility norms for admission. • Research centres admitted the students on the basis of their Ph.D. entrance test.

Feedback Obtained

The main objective of the feedback mechanism is to realize own potential. After analyzing the same, future course of action are planned for the development of the college. Students, teachers and parents are the stakeholders of the college. In this college the feedback has been collected in mid of the academic session. The feedback format was designed to measure the perceptions of each stakeholder regarding curriculum, co-curriculum/extra curriculum activities, teaching-learning process, amenities in the campus. For receiving feedback from stakeholder questionnaire were supplied to them and responses were recorded. Student feedback are taken regarding curriculum, amenities/college facilities and feedback for teachers. Questions included were mainly to know the efficiency of the curriculum for their personal development. Various facilities provided by the college, different activities organized in the college for personal development and social awareness were also evaluated. Questions for student feedback on teachers mainly includes, the teaching-learning process. Parents feedback virtually focused on teaching-learning process, college facility and curriculum. As a stakeholder, teacher's feedback on curriculum emphasized the assessment of present curriculum with respect to available resources and innovation in teaching technology. Feedbacks received from all the stakeholders were sorted and consolidated for drafting and analysis report. A parameter wise analysis has been made on the percentage basis and the aspects pointed out by all stakeholders are considered with special care and attention. Then the suggestions received from different sphere regarding curriculum, amenities and teaching learning process were discussed and evaluated. After discussion with IQAC and Principal the feedback Committee wrings out the final conclusions. It is pointed out that curriculum must be effective in future aspirations of the students and parents. For the development of the college, it should fulfil social aspirations. Various activities organized in the college play positive role in social awareness. Teachers should imbibe innovative teaching technology for enhancing teaching learning process.

For the under graduate students of science faculty and students of Arts faculty (Psychology and Geography) the university evaluates them in both theory and practical examination .In Post Graduate level the evaluation is done through theory papers and assignment performance as per the university prospectus. As per the university calendar the committee comprised of Internal valuation committee , Examination cell, Time table committee and IQAC chalk out the programme for Internal valuation through Pre-university exams and unit tests. The Questions for Pre-university exams are set as per the university examination .To carry out the internal exams faculty members sincerely prepare Question papers keeping in view the pattern of the University Question papers. Internal valuation committee prepares a separate time table for the examination and the evaluation is being done by the faculty members. After analysis the results of the students are compared with their previous result and the students are provided with guidelines for improvement.

Question paper Setting, Management of the examination, evaluation of answer books and result publication are done as per the pattern followed by the affiliating university.

The faculty members prepare a comparison chart by comparing the question papers of Pre-university Examination and the following Annual Examination Question Papers. Students are benefitted through this particular process regarding probable Questions.

Teaching and Learning

Teaching plans for the course modules for every session are prepared as daily teaching, monthly and yearly schedule. Teaching and learning is regularly monitored by the principal and HOD of the concerned department. Feedbacks from the students are collected at least once in a year and appropriate actions are initiated for improvement of quality in teaching and learning. Unit tests and pre annual examinations are conducted as per the academic calendar. For excellent academic environment and to enrich the knowledge of the students, guest lectures, workshops, seminars are organised by various departments. Experiential learning, Moot courts and Legal Aid camps are organised for Law students. Participating learning, problem solving methodologies are used. Field visits/ excursion/tours/ Sample survey / data collection/project work are organized. For effective teaching, Some Faculty members use power point presentation by LCD Projectors.

Curriculum Development

Curriculum designing and development is decided by the affiliating university. Principal and faculty members interact with the university and provide their views related to curriculum development in meetings of board of studies. 14 faculties are members of the board of study in affiliated university and central board of studies.

Admission of Students

1. Online Admission is done on the basis of University rules and regulation and all reservation policies are followed. 2. The college has admission committee monitored by teaching and non-teaching staff 3. A help desk is available to guide the students and parents regarding various matters related to the admission process. 4. To ensure transparency in the admission process, for all the courses online applications are invited in advance by the university. A merit list is prepared by college. Admission lists and a waiting lists are also put

up, strictly according the government rules. 5. The college website and the prospectus contain information about the institution and the programmes offered. The prospectus that highlights the details of various programmes of the college is prepared every year prior to the commencement of admissions. The prospectus also gives details of eligibility norms for admission. It is given to the applicants along with the application form. Research centres admitted the students on the basis of their Ph.D. entrance test.
